This half-term, our big question is: 'Is change always a good thing?'

Our half-term of learning will be driven by the knowledge we will be acquiring in history. We will learn about life from the Stone Age to the Iron Age. In English, we will be exploring the Stone Age Boy by Satoshi Kitamura. We will develop our understanding of the plot and characters to rewrite and innovate the story.



English

In English, we will be writing a narrative story. We will:

- rewrite the Stone Age Boy story focusing on openings and endings.
- write correctly punctuated dialogue for characters in the story.
- use tenses correctly.
- add historical detail.

Geography

In History we will be learning about:

- the changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age
- local history- linking to Merrivale on Dartmoor
- Neolithic stone rows, circles and Neolithic & bronze age settlements

Vocabulary

The development of vocabulary is important to us at Sacred Heart. Through this enquiry project we will develop the following vocabulary:
