# **Ancient Greece**

**BIG Question** 

Should everyone have the right to make decisions?

Welcome back year three! We hope you had a wonderful Christmas and are ready to begin a new year of learning! This half term, our big question is: 'Should everyone have the right to make decisions?'

Our half term of learning will be driven by the knowledge we will acquire in history. The children will learn about primary and secondary sources of evidence about life in Ancient Greece and how their legacies influence modern lifestyles.



## **English**

In English, inspired by Michael Foreman's Seal Surfer, we will be practising our recount and letter writing skills. This links to our science this term: Humans, including animals.

- •Building a rich and varied vocabulary. Grouping ideas into paragraphs
- Using inverted commas in speech
- Using expanded noun phrases to build description.
- Using prepositions to explain time, place and cause

### History

In History we will be learning about:

- Continue to sequence events on a timeline;
- Discover the location of Greece and Ancient Greece:
- Learn about Greek life;
- Discover about Greek Gods and Goddesses;
- Learn about changes in Greek architectural and military achievements which impact on our lives today.


