## 2021-2022 Evaluation

Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
<ul> <li>The return of site visits to Paignton Academy (PA) and the physical links between our local schools was a grateful return for 21-22. The cluster began small following covid but continued to strengthen with additional opportunities for sport being available. Classes from Y1 to Y6 participated in all festivals on offer.</li> <li>The employment of a sports lead at lunchtimes has increased physical activity for three days a week with MTAs learning from his expertise. New Play Leaders trained and new equipment purchased following consultation with the children through google forms.</li> <li>A low level activity trail has been fitted in the garden to allow for further activity and multiple markings on the playground. Play Leaders are trained in getting the equipment ready and modelling usage.</li> <li>We have invested in the scheme GetSet4PE to ensure progression</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Swimming</li> <li>Being a coastal town, we are aware of the importance of children learning to swim. In addition to the statutory curriculum time, we would like all KS2 children to have termly swimming opportunities. This will support 100% success at the end of Y6 in swimming 25m with confidence and mean that the children can access the local free opportunities of sea swimming with their families - safely.</li> <li>Active Lunchtimes</li> <li>Increase to 5 days</li> <li>Equipment</li> <li>Ensuring all equipment is in place for teaching GetSet4PE</li> </ul>

KGS provided bespoke training for all staff in April, providing individual feedback on teaching and learning methods.</li> <li>Active after school clubs have returned three times a week on a rota of activities from archery to zorbing (and lots in between). Take up was</li> </ul>	
slow to start with covid restrictions still causing some problems but as the year has progressed, more pupils have accessed the clubs.	

The PE Lead completed a year of her L5 PE leaders training. She used her new knowledge to work closely with KSG to monitor the provision and make improvements.	
Assessment systems have been improved. Bikeability took place on the roads once again with 14 pupils participating.	
Y4 went on a free residential to PGL to test out the new pioneers programme. This is something we will offer in future years at local centres to keep the cost down.	
Due to swimming being cancelled (local school could not commit to our agreement), we purchased balanced bikes for KS1. We are yet to see the I pact as only arrived at the end of the academic year.

With the playground zoned, it seemed to work better than previous attempts. Having a designated adult overseeing has made a difference. A wide variety of clubs have taken place over the year from traditional football and cricket to zorbing, hover boarding and archery. Gymnastics has proven particularly popular so we hope to make it a permanent fixture when we move to 5 clubs next year. Feedback from the parent and children will influence all choices. In the summer months, we hope to have indoor and outdoor activities too. Staff are enthusiastic about starting a cheerleading and dance club but we are lacking space. The inter-house competitions did not take off as the pedometers were too cheap. We will try and relaunch next year.
