Our half term of learning will be driven by the knowledge we will be acquiring in Geography. Climate zones and biomes are crucial to the well-being of our planet and knowledge of how different parts of the globe experience different weather and climate is increasingly important as we face issues over climate change. Year 5 have been given the task by Dartmoor National Park Authority to design and publish leaflets on how landowners, farmers and families can help preserve and encourage the growth of our local temperate rainforests. The children will be visiting Wistman's Wood on Dartmoor, one of the few remaining fragments of English rainforest, and learning all about this fragile and important ecosystem. Towards the end of the Enqiry Project (EP), they will produce a piece of mixed media art based on their field visit to Wistman's Wood.


