What Makes a Good Leader?

English

Whilst revising and re-visiting the year 6 English objectives, we will carry out a text study of 'Clockwork or all Wound up' by Philip Pullman. In response to this, we will be exploring new vocabulary, producing character studies, writing in role, designing travel brochures, studying film shorts and performing an oral story telling of a spooky story. Having looked at several stories from the same genre and understanding the writer's tools needed to create this sort of text, pupils will create their own spooky, fantasy story. These will be published and turned into a class anthology.

History

By the end of this unit, pupils will have learned about significant British leaders post 1066 building on prior learning in Year 4 and Year 5. They will have explored major events such as the signing of the Magna Carta, King Richard and the Princes in the Tower, the English Civil Wars, the Reformation and the Restoration.

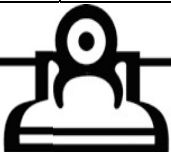

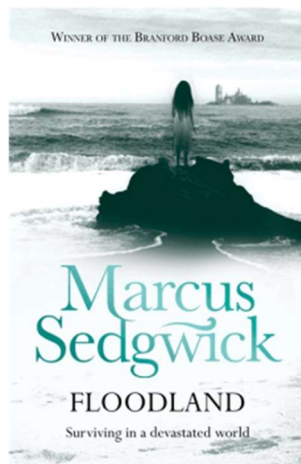
