BIG Question

Is it important to buy food from local sources?

Welcome back year three! We hope you had a relaxing and well-deserved half term.

Our half term of learning will be driven by the knowledge we will be acquiring in Science and Design Technology. The children will learn about plants and the life cycle of a plant. This will link to local farming at Occombe Farm. Children will develop an understanding of seasonal foods, their availability and where fruits, vegetables and meats come from. Children will use all this knowledge, along with an understanding of healthy eating, to design then make healthy pizza.



English

In English, we will:

- Form nouns with a range of prefixes;
- Use present and past tenses correctly and consistently including the progressive and present perfect forms;
- Build a varied and rich vocabulary;
- Use inverted commas to punctuate direct speech;
- Use small details to describe characters;
- Include a setting to create atmosphere;
- Write a sequence of events to follow the structure of the model story.

Science and Design Technology

- In Science we will:
 - Learn to name and label parts of plants and flowers;
 - · Grow and monitor flowers, learning what they need;
 - Learn about the lifecycle of plants and flowers.

In Design and Technology we understand:

- that food is grown (such as tomatoes, wheat and potatoes), reared (such as pigs, chickens and cattle) in the UK, Europe and the wider world;
- that seasons may affect the food available;
- how food is processed into ingredients that can be eaten or used in cooking:
- Design and make a pizza, developing specific culinary skills.

Vocabulary

The development of vocabulary is important to us at Sacred Heart. This half term the children will develop the following vocabulary:


